CP supporters and partners sent 84 letters to their elected representatives in support of the Employment Nondiscrimination Act, which passed into law in May 2007

Pam Jones and Juliet Draper were recipients of the Divine Award for their work for equal rights in the Pikes Peak region, and Jim Alice Scott received the Lifetime Achievement Award

In November, Citizens Project sent out over 100 letters and packets to schools in the Pikes Peak Region with information about separation of Church and State and the "December Dilemma"

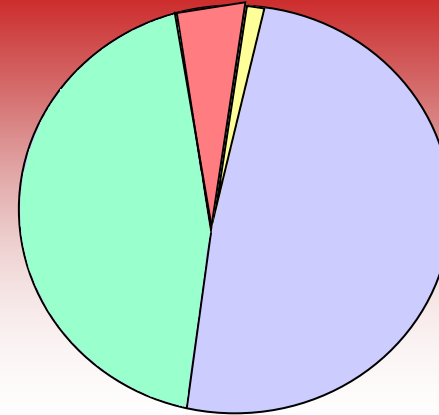


Citizens Project responded to violations of Church/State separation at local schools



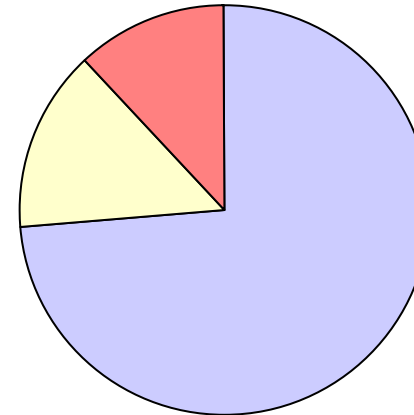
Financial Information
